Our youngest Promise scholarship candidate just turned one years old in May. It's hard to believe that the beautiful room where he sleeps now was a junky pile of decaying wood, charred debris, and trash just one year ago. The property was condemned and build-dozed in June 2017. People were wondering about the lot size. Can a house valued at \$150,000 be built here? Six months later, little Leo and his parents, Justin and Bethany, moved into a stunning new ranch home with 3 bedrooms and 2 baths. They even have a nice-size yard for their two dogs and, unheard of in Powell-Poage-Hamilton Neighborhood, an attached garage.

Bethany Matsick heard about the Promise program when she visited an open house in another part of the city, hosted by Spies Construction. "The home I was looking at didn't qualify but Delores Spies told me about the Promise program and she let me know when another Promise lot would be available that she could build on."

A La Crosse native, Bethany graduated from Central High School and attended Viterbo University. She currently works for the county. Her husband Justin is from Phillips, Wi. He attended Lakeland University and now works for Eastbay and also coaches basketball in the summer at Central. After college, Bethany moved away for a bit but then moved back to La Crosse. "I am so excited to be back here and to see this neighborhood change this year and watch the great changes for years to come!"



Once they were approved for Leo's scholarship, the process went quickly. "It was really easier than we thought," Bethany said.
