Bucky's Tuition Promise is a commitment to Wisconsin resident students.

The program guarantees scholarships and grants to pay for tuition and segregated fees for students whose household adjusted gross income (AGI) is \$56,000 or less. Incoming freshmen will receive eight (8) consecutive semesters (4 years) of free tuition & segregated fees and transfer students will receive four (4) semesters (2 years).

Army Emergency Relief for Dependent Children of Active Duty, Retired and Deceased Soldiers

The MG James Ursano Scholarship Program is a need-based scholarship program established to assist children of Army Soldiers in obtaining their first undergraduate degree. Applicants must reapply each year and may receive assistance for up to four academic years as long as they meet the eligibility criteria explained in the document below. The award amounts vary each year based on the number of applicants, total approved scholarship budget, the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) from the Student Aid Report (SAR) from the FAFSA, and the average Cost of Attendance to attend a college or university in the United States as provided by the College Board. For the 2018-2019 academic year, awards ranged from \$500 to \$3,400.

AB Nicholas Scholarship (UW-System)

The Ab Nicholas Scholarship Foundation seeks to make a college degree affordable for Wisconsin high school students who participate as players or managers in their school's basketball program. Need-based scholarships (\$5,000-10,000), renewable annually, are offered for two- and four-year programs at any University of Wisconsin System school.

Athletic Requirements:

You must be participating in your high school's boys or girls basketball program during this (your senior) year either as a player or a manager.

Financial Requirements

The foundation uses your completed Free Application For Student Aid form ([FAFSA](#)) to determine financial need. You may also apply for and receive other financial aid.

Educational Requirements

You must be a 2019 graduating senior of a Wisconsin high school – public or private.

You must attend a [University of Wisconsin System school](#) as a full-time student (at least 12 credits), enrolled in a 2-year or 4-year program.

To renew your scholarship, you must maintain performance consistent with the original award criteria, including a cumulative grade point average greater than 2.0.

Other Requirements

You must be a bona fide resident of Wisconsin.

You will need a unique student ID number for the UW System school(s) you are applying to.

You will need a completed [FAFSA](#) form on file (Free Application For Student Aid) for your application to be considered.

You will need to file an application online during the enrollment period of February 1 – April 30 of your senior year.

- Lawton Grant; reserved for minorities. Students receive up to \$2,500 per year, for up to 8 semesters, or a maximum total grant of \$10,000. <https://financialaid.wisc.edu/types-of-aid/grants/lawton/>
- Wisconsin Space Grant Consortium for students enrolled in undergraduate programs, pursuing aerospace science degrees. The TIP grant can be renewed for up to ten semesters of enrollment and must be used within six years of enrollment at a public, private, or technical college or university in Wisconsin. First-come, first-serve basis.
