Bucky's Tuition Promise is a commitment to Wisconsin resident students.

The program guarantees scholarships and grants to pay for tuition and segregated fees for students whose household adjusted gross income (AGI) is \$56,000 or less. Incoming freshmen will receive eight (8) consecutive semesters (4 years) of free tuition & segregated fees and transfer students will receive four (4) semesters (2 years).

3. Attach or mail separately two letters of recommendation from a teacher, counselor, principal, community leader or employer -- people who know you.
4. Attach or mail separately acceptance letter from the college or university which you will be attending or confirm enrollment if you are a continuing student.

The American Indian College Fund provides scholarships to American Indian and Alaska Native college students seeking undergraduate and graduate degrees at: – Tribal colleges & universities – All nonprofit & accredited schools:

U.S. citizen or Canadian eligible to attend college in the U.S. under provisions of the Jay Treaty;
Enrolled in a certificate, associate, bachelor's, or graduate program at an accredited tribal, public, or private (non-profit) college or university; Full-time enrollment (Full Circle applicants only);
Registered as an enrolled member of a federal or state recognized tribe, or a descendant of at least one grandparent or parent who is an enrolled tribal member. Alaska Natives may use Native Corporation membership. [Learn how to prove descent or trace Indian ancestry.](#)

Revive Solutions

Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) takes more lives each year than AIDS, some common cancers such as breast and lung, car accidents, house fires, and gunshot wounds – COMBINED! SCA affects all ages, races, and genders. Yet, unlike other injuries and illnesses, there's a therapy that can save the majority of SCA victims - early defibrillation with an AED! Unfortunately, when someone is experiencing SCA, time is of the essence, and victims lose approximately 7-10% chance of survival for every minute that passes.

- Did you know?
- SCA leads to over 350,000 deaths per year in the United States.
- Between 7,000 and 10,000 school-aged children die of SCA each year.
- Most SCAs occur in the home (68.5%) but most homes don't have a life-saving AED.
- That a [layperson-friendly definition of SCA](#) can drive awareness and bystander action.

Based on these statistics and others you find during your research, how would you drive awareness about the importance of CPR and using an AED? Why do you think more people don't know about this public health epidemic and what creative ways would you introduce more AEDs to the public? Once you've figured out how you'd drive awareness (and save more lives!), share your proposal with us by **submitting either a video (less than 5 minutes) or short essay (less than 1,000 words)**. The more innovative and creative your scholarship submission is, the better. Extra points will be awarded for originality and submissions that could work in real life.
